**Proposal ceilings on Financial Assistance – Modified Guidelines**

Proposals received from Voluntary Cultural Organisations/Clubs/Association/Institutions and others are unique in each one as they relates to different aspects of Arts and Culture with specific emphasize on respective areas such as Fine Arts, Visual Arts, Performance Arts, Heritage, and these are further sub-divided into different genre, such as Music, Theatres, Art Works, Paintings, Photography, etc. with sub-genres of each agenda for e.g. Pop, Rock Metal, South Country Rock, Jazz, Blues, etc. and each sub-genre beings performed by performing Artistes at different levels of expertise as in amateur, experience, semi professional, with performances, etc. happening from Block Level/District Level/State Level/National Level/International Level, and because, each other artists in each sub-genres belonging to main genre performing at different levels, is unique, laying down a specific ceiling for each proposals is not feasible. However, each proposals is being scrutinized on an individual for basis as per all aspects of the Guidelines as approved by Planning Department and also ensuring that only the deserving Individuals, Organisations, Clubs, etc. are actually recommended for assistance as per their proposals.

Each proposals relates to different aspects of promotion of the Arts & Culture of the State and each proposals is unique from the Organisational aspects of the respective programme. Therefore laying down a ceiling for each aspect of every arts and every cultural activities is attempted Modification below, as it is felt that concentration should be given to those aspects of different areas and these aspects of culture which are (a) Dying (b) Upcoming/News (c) Innovative which will have long term impact on people of our states and take the states forward in the numerous areas of arts and culture (Music, dance, literatures, languages). Therefore, it is immediately proposed, that the ceiling may be broadly categorized as below : -
