Special Intensive Revision (SIR), 2026 – Meghalaya - Status as on 14 July 2026

Shillong, 14 July 2026: The Special Intensive Revision (SIR), 2026 of the Electoral Roll in Meghalaya continues to witness encouraging progress through the concerted efforts of the election machinery and the active cooperation of electors across the State.

As on 14 July 2026 (09:58:12 AM), out of a total 23,49,645 electors, 19,91,883 Enumeration Forms (EFs) have been distributed, achieving an overall 84.77% coverage. In addition, 5,64,610 Enumeration Forms have been digitized, accounting for 24.03% of the total electorate.

The districts registering the highest Enumeration Form distribution are:

1. West Jaintia Hills – 98.94%
2. South West Garo Hills – 97.77%
3. North Garo Hills – 95.12%
4. South West Khasi Hills – 90.37%
5. East Garo Hills – 88.84%

The districts recording the highest digitization of Enumeration Forms are:

1. East Jaintia Hills – 41.55%
2. South West Khasi Hills – 40.31%
3. Eastern West Khasi Hills – 36.73%
4. South West Garo Hills – 34.01%
5. West Garo Hills – 33.23%

As part of the Commission's efforts to enhance awareness and public participation, the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, conducted an Awareness and Interaction Programme on the Special Intensive Revision (SIR), 2026 with the Hon'ble Members of the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly in hybrid mode (online & offline mode) on 13th July, 2026 at the Conference Hall, MLA Hostel,

Shillong. During the interaction, the Chief Electoral Officer explained the objectives, significance, timelines and procedures of the Special Intensive Revision and sought the support of the Hon'ble Members in creating awareness among the electorate and encouraging eligible citizens to actively participate in the revision exercise.

To ensure effective monitoring and timely implementation of the Special Intensive Revision, the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, has also been conducting weekly video conferences with the District Election Officers (DEOs), Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) and Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs). During these review meetings, the progress of house-to-house distribution of Enumeration Forms, digitization of Enumeration Forms, and other activities under the SIR programme is reviewed in detail. The officers have been instructed to closely monitor the work of the Booth Level Officers (BLOs), promptly resolve issues at the field level, and ensure that all activities are carried out smoothly and completed strictly within the timelines prescribed by the Election Commission of India.

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, appreciates the tireless efforts of the District Election Officers, Electoral Registration Officers, Assistant Electoral Registration Officers, Booth Level Officers, BLO Supervisors and all election officials for their dedication towards the successful implementation of the Special Intensive Revision across the State.

Electors who have not yet received or submitted their Enumeration Forms are requested to cooperate with the Booth Level Officers during their house-to-house visits and complete the process at the earliest. Electors may also contact their respective Booth Level Officers for any assistance regarding the Special Intensive Revision.

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, once again appeals to all eligible electors to actively participate in the Special Intensive Revision, 2026 and ensure that every eligible citizen is included in the Electoral Roll, thereby strengthening the democratic process and upholding the principle of inclusive and participative elections.
