Special Intensive Revision (SIR), 2026 in Meghalaya - Status as on 21st July 2026

Shillong, 21 July 2026: The Special Intensive Revision (SIR), 2026 of the Electoral Roll in Meghalaya has achieved another major milestone with 98.17% of Enumeration Forms (EFs) distributed across the State, reflecting the continued commitment of the election machinery and the enthusiastic participation of the electorate.

As on 21 July 2026, out of a total 23,49,645 electors, 23,06,585 Enumeration Forms (EFs) have been distributed, achieving an overall **98.17% coverage**. Simultaneously, 14,07,446 Enumeration Forms have been digitized, accounting for **62.15%** of the total electorate, marking significant progress in the digitization process.

As on 21st July 2026, a total of 53,908 electors, constituting 2.29% of the total electorate in the State, have been identified under the Absentee, Shifted, Death and Duplicate (ASDD) categories. Of these, 5,795 electors have been identified as absent, 13,379 as shifted, 32,382 as death, 2,029 as duplicate, while 323 electors refused to accept the Enumeration Form. These cases will be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the Registration of Electors Rules, 1960, after following the prescribed verification process and providing due opportunity to the concerned electors wherever applicable, before any decision is taken regarding the electoral roll.

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, reiterates that **electors who do not submit their duly filled Enumeration Forms within the prescribed timeline will not have their names included in the Draft Electoral Roll scheduled to be published on 5th August, 2026 and will be displayed in all the Polling Stations**. All eligible electors are therefore advised to ensure that their Enumeration Forms are

submitted to their respective Booth Level Officers (BLOs) or through the online mode by downloading the ECINET App or visit the website <https://voters.eci.gov.in> well before the deadline to facilitate their inclusion in the Draft Electoral Roll.

To ensure effective implementation and timely completion of the Special Intensive Revision, the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, has been conducting weekly video conferences with the District Election Officers (DEOs), Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) and Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs). These review meetings focus on monitoring the progress of house-to-house distribution and collection of Enumeration Forms, digitization of Enumeration Forms and other SIR-related activities. The district election machinery has been directed to closely supervise the work of Booth Level Officers (BLOs), promptly address field-level issues and ensure that all activities are completed smoothly within the timeline prescribed by the Election Commission of India.

On 21st July 2026, the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, also held a meeting with representatives of recognized National and State Political Parties to review the progress of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR), 2026. During the meeting, the Chief Electoral Officer appreciated the active participation of the political parties and acknowledged the appointment of **892 Booth Level Agents (BLAs)** across the State. The BLAs are expected to play a vital role in assisting electors, verifying electoral roll details and ensuring greater transparency and accuracy in the Special Intensive Revision process. The Chief Electoral Officer urged all political parties to continue extending their cooperation for the timely and successful completion of the SIR exercise.

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, commends the dedicated efforts of the District Election Officers, Electoral Registration Officers, Assistant Electoral Registration Officers, Booth Level Officers, BLO Supervisors and all officials associated with the Special Intensive Revision for achieving this remarkable progress.

Electors who have not yet received or submitted their Enumeration Forms are requested to cooperate with the Booth Level Officers during their house-to-house visits and complete the process without delay. Electors may also contact their respective Booth Level Officers for any assistance relating to the Special Intensive Revision.

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Meghalaya, reiterates its appeal to all eligible electors to actively participate in the Special Intensive Revision, 2026 and ensure that every eligible citizen is included in the Electoral Roll, thereby strengthening free, fair, inclusive and participative elections.
