Doloi of Jowai encourages electorates to vote in large numbers

Jowai: Pura Kynjing, the Doloi of Jowai on Tuesday joined hands with CEO Meghalaya in educating people of Jowai about the importance of voting, and urged the tribal populace to vote in large numbers on April 19.

As voting for the Lok Sabha election is scheduled to be held on April 19 in Meghalaya, the office of the Chief Electoral Officer Meghalaya on Tuesday had organized an awareness programme at Iawmusiang in Jowai, the headquarters of the West Jaintia Hills district.
