PGT Shillong Expands Infrastructure with MPLAD-Funded Classroom Inauguration

The College of Teacher Education (PGT), Shillong held a formal programme on 17th October 2025 to inaugurate a newly constructed additional classroom funded under the Members of Parliament Local Area Development (MPLAD) Scheme 2024–2025.
