### **Bihar Legislative Assembly's Committee on Subordinate Legislation Visits Meghalaya Assembly**

**Shillong, June 15, 2026:** The Committee on Subordinate Legislation of the Bihar Legislative Assembly on Monday held an interaction meeting with its counterpart from the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly during a study visit to the State.

The meeting was chaired by the Hon'ble Speaker of the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly, Shri Thomas A. Sangma.

The Committee on Subordinate Legislation is an important legislative mechanism functioning within State Legislative Assemblies across India. Its primary role is to examine and report to the House on whether the powers delegated by the Legislature to the Executive for framing rules, regulations, bye-laws and other subordinate legislation are being exercised within the scope and intent of the parent legislation.
