Union Minister of State for AYUSH & Health and Family Welfare Visits North Garo Hills

Resubelpara, November 8: Union Minister of State for AYUSH and Minister of State for Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, Shri Prataprao Ganpatrao Jadhav, visited North Garo Hills district on Saturday to conduct an extensive review of the implementation of Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS).



The visit began with an on-site inspection of the Resubelpara Community Health Centre, including the Ayurveda & Homeopathy (AYUSH) OPD, MGNREGA work sites, and interactions with Village Health Councils and PMAY (G) beneficiaries.



Underscoring his emphasis on grassroots participation, the Minister engaged in detailed discussions with members of Self Help Groups (SHGs) to understand their entrepreneurial journeys, challenges, and the transformative role of the National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) in empowering women and fostering financial independence.

During the comprehensive review meeting with district officials, Shri Jadhav expressed satisfaction with the district's overall performance, particularly in implementing central schemes.
