Hon'ble President was accompanied by the Hon'ble Governor of Meghalaya, Shri. Paghu Chauhan, Meghalaya Chief Minister. Shri. Conrad K Sangma, Meghalaya Health Minister Dr. M Ampareen Lyngdoh and senior government officers led by the Meghalaya Chief Secretary, Shri D. P Wahlang.

During the unveiling, Hon'ble President was appraised of the role played by the three martyrs' in their uprising against British rule, which led to the ultimate sacrifice of their lives for the sake of their motherland.

Before her departure from Shillong, the Hon'ble President also planted a tree at Raj Bhavan.
